



*- This amount is determined by the Parish Finance Council. It is based on the annual cost of Parish operations for the parish year, 01 Jul thru 30 Jun. The annual cost includes items such as the maintenance for our buildings, utilities, all Mass and church supplies, salaries for staff, support for the school...everything right down to the Kleenex provided in the church. The annual amount is then divided by the 12 months in a year to establish the monthly amount necessary. The tithing collections offered by our parishioners each week, our only income, is reported in the spirit of transparency for all. When we fall short in our collections for the needed monthly operating expenses, the difference must be pulled from investments or savings to cover the operating expenses. This impairs our sustainability to 'grow' our parish programs and services in the future.

Don't forget to teach our children how to submit their envelopes weekly! Take one with you to fill out for the following weekend if that is of help instead fixing one on the way into Mass.

PENTECOST

The great Pope Leo XIII (1878-1903) wrote with bitterness: "Many Christians have an excessive poor knowledge about the Holy Spirit. They mention His name in pious exercises, but their faith is no longer alive. They do not speak about His gifts; they do not know them except for a few lines they learned at catechism" (Encyclical: Divinum Illud Munus).

Pentecost celebrates the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and the beginning of the Church. 50 Days after Jesus' resurrection, the apostles were gathered together, waiting for the promised "Holy Spirit" to come upon them. The Holy Spirit empowered the Apostles as it was promised by Jesus. Moved by the Spirit, the Apostles began to preach the gospel and established His Church to the ends of the earth through their life witness.

The power of the Holy Spirit is the life of all Christians; as a Church, we are called to reach beyond our own borders, our own comfort and find our place within the entire body of believers. We as Baptized Christians, filled with the same Holy Spirit that came down on the Apostles on Pentecost, are to offer the witness of the kingdom of God to our family, our society and the global community.

Come Holy Spirit!

A STEWARD'S CONVICTION

All temporal and spiritual goods are created by and come from God. That is true of everything human beings have: spiritual gifts like faith, hope, and love; talents of body and brain; cherished relationships with family and friends; material goods; the achievements of human genius and skill; the world itself. One day God will require an accounting



of the use each person has made of the particular portion of these goods entrusted to him or her.

Each will be measured by the standard of his or her individual vocation. Each has received a different "sum"—a unique mix of talents, opportunities, challenges, weaknesses and strengths, potential modes of service and response—on which the Master expects a return. He will judge individuals according to what they have done with what they were given.

The authentic disciple regards all he or she is and possesses as gifts and blessings and realizes the need to share those gifts and blessings with others for the sake of the kingdom of God.

One way to ensure your blessings is to be a responsive steward of time, talent and treasure. Our liturgies are in great need of Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers, ushers, gift bearers and altar servers! It is time to answer the call and build your 'bank of givings' for time, talent and treasure.

According to the 1992 U.S. Bishop's Pastoral Letter, *Stewardship: A Disciple's Response*, a steward is defined as a disciple of Jesus who "receives God's gifts gratefully, cultivates them responsibly, share them lovingly in justice with others and returns them with increase to the Lord." What will you return to the Lord?



O most blessed Light divine, Shine within these hearts of yours, and our inmost being fill!


Where you are not, we have naught, nothing good in deed or thought, nothing free from taint of ill.


