

\* - This amount is determined by the Parish Finance Council. It is based on the annual cost of Parish operations for the parish year, 01 Jul thru 30 Jun. The annual cost includes items such as the maintenance for our buildings, utilities, all Mass and church supplies, salaries for staff, support for the school...everything right down to the Kleenex provided in the church. The annual amount is then divided by the 12 months in a year to establish the monthly amount necessary. The tithing collections offered by our parishioners each week, our only income, is reported in the spirit of transparency for all. When we fall short in our collections for the needed monthly operating expenses, the difference must be pulled from investments or savings to cover the operating expenses. This impairs our sustainability to 'grow' our parish programs and services in the future.

Don't forget to teach our children how to submit their envelopes weekly! Take one with you to fill out for the following weekend if that is of help instead fixing one on the way into Mass.

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### **BELLS AT MASS?**

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (2000, #150) states that a bell may be rung regularly at two places during the Mass: First, "a little before the consecration, the minister may ring a bell as a signal to the people" normally when the priest joins his hands and holds them over the bread and wine to be consecrated. At the same time he prays for the Holy Spirit to come down upon the gifts so that they may become the Body and Blood of our Lord.

Second, "according to local custom, a minister also rings the bell at the showing of both the Eucharistic Bread and the chalice." After the priest says the words of consecration, he elevates the Sacred Host or the chalice of Precious Blood. The ringing of the bell again alerts the faithful that the Body and Blood of our Lord is truly present on the altar.

The ringing of bells is not required and it is up to the discretion of the presider. Some do not because they want the whole Eucharistic Prayer to be seen as sacred and transforming the elements. I would also note that the there is a second calling down of the Spirit in the prayer. It comes after the consecration and calls for an equal transformation: that we be filled with the Spirit and "become one body, One Spirit in Christ."

A final note: we Catholics emphasize in our liturgy the incarnation of Christ, his taking on our flesh. Thus we use all the senses: hearing the Word of God or bells, seeing all the many symbols, smelling the incense or oil of Chrism, tasting the bread and wine and feeling his presence when it all comes together. A good liturgy uses all to express our love for God (and one another) and to let God express his love for us.

May God continue to bless all of us. Father Kerry






