

* - This amount is determined by the Parish Finance Council. It is based on the annual cost of Parish operations for the parish year, 01 Jul thru 30 Jun. The annual cost includes items such as the maintenance for our buildings, utilities, all Mass and church supplies, salaries for staff, support for the school...everything right down to the Kleenex provided in the church. The annual amount is then divided by the 12 months in a year to establish the monthly amount necessary. The tithing collections offered by our parishioners each week, our only income, is reported in the spirit of transparency for all. When we fall short in our collections for the needed monthly operating expenses, the difference must be pulled from investments or savings to cover the operating expenses. This impairs our sustainability to 'grow' our parish programs and services in the future.

Don't forget to teach our children how to submit their envelopes weekly! Take one with you to fill out for the following weekend if that is of help instead fixing one on the way into Mass.

CATECHECTICAL SUNDAY: Each year the Catholic Church in United States marks one of the Sundays as Catechetical Sunday. The Church presumes that the Catholic Schools are going, Religious Education Coordinators have found their teachers, the OCIA has begun and the adult education groups have started forming by this time.

Who are Catechists? All those who teach the Catholic faith and share the Church's teachings are catechists. The word *catechesis* is from a Greek word meaning "to echo." All those who teach in the Church's name and about Jesus by the way they live are catechists. Parents and guardians are also catechists; they are the first and primary teachers of the faith for their children. In the end all of us "echo" Christ, some in a more designated role.

In May of 2021, Pope Francis established the lay ministry of catechist in the Catholic Church in his apostolic letter Antiquum ministerium. This document officially declared that catechists are to be recognized as lay ministers in the Catholic Church and are due the training and support they need to be successful in their ministry.

On Catechetical Sunday, we come together as both a parish and Church community to acknowledge the dedication of those who serve as catechists in our parish family. We also honor parents and guardians on this day, since they are the true first catechists, sharing the Catholic faith with their families.

In the name of the parish, I as pastor/leader say a big THANK YOU to all who have stepped up, stepped "in" as it were to lead and teach. Please know you have our support.



October 3 - The Second Vatican Council

What is the Relationship between Scripture and Tradition? Presenter - Fr. Frank Coady

A classic point of disagreement between the Catholic church and many Protestant churches has been that the Catholic church believes teachings that are not explicitly found in Scripture but developed over time through what we call "tradition." Evangelical churches usually believe that teachings can only come from what is explicitly stated in the Bible.

The Synod is still going on. While it has moved on to a gathering in Rome, synodality remains. "Tuesdays with the Diocese" offers an invitation to listen to one story and consider what our story is. It offers an opportunity to continue listening to the Spirit as we listen to others.

Pope Francis reminds us synodality has a soul that is the Spirit who speaks and listens. We <u>listen</u> to others <u>share</u> their story...not <u>hear</u> them <u>tell</u> their story. There's a difference. To listen and truly hear we need prayer.

To share our story, we need prayer to notice the moments when we've experienced God's presence in our life and in the world. To notice what experiences inspired us to love or grieve or act.
