



* - This amount is determined by the Parish Finance Council. It is based on the annual cost of Parish operations for the parish year, 01 Jul thru 30 Jun. The annual cost includes items such as the maintenance for our buildings, utilities, all Mass and church supplies, salaries for staff, support for the school...everything right down to the Kleenex provided in the church. The annual amount is then divided by the 12 months in a year to establish the monthly amount necessary. The tithing collections offered by our parishioners each week, our only income, is reported in the spirit of transparency for all. When we fall short in our collections for the needed monthly operating expenses, the difference must be pulled from investments or savings to cover the operating expenses. This impairs our sustainability to 'grow' our parish programs and services in the future.

Don't forget to teach our children how to submit their envelopes weekly! Take one with you to fill out for the following weekend if that is of help instead fixing one on the way into Mass.

EATING/CONSUMING/TRANSFORMATION: Our Prayer after Communion last Sunday ended with "....and be transformed into what we consume." This is taken from St. Augustine who had many variations of this but by his death, it had this form right before reception of Communion:

Presider: "Behold what you are."

Response: "May we become what we receive."

At Mass we place ourselves upon the Altar at the Presentation and we pray through the Consecration that as the bread and wine are transformed, so may be transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. The most important take recovery away is that in the event of any emergency, Listen to the Ushers. In the pews are forms to complete if you have health/safety/law enforcement experience and you are willing to assist in

an emergency when your expertise would be helpful. The information is being updated so please complete a form even if you filled one out in the past. You may put the form in the collection basket or drop it off at the parish office. Thank you.

St. Francis Xavier Parish Crisis Plan

Saint Francis Xavier Parish has a Crisis Response Plan for the most common emergencies that may arise during a parish event taking place in the church (medical, fire, weather related, protestors, violence inside or outside the church, unauthorized/agitated person, active shooter). The ushers have been trained to respond to these situations.

Parishioners with health/safety/law enforcement expertise have signed up in advance to assist the ushers with an emergency when appropriate. Please allow ushers and these individuals to take the lead in emergency situations.

LISTEN AND FOLLOW THE DIRECTIONS OF THE USHERS IN ANY EMERGENCY.

The ushers wear an "usher badge" for identification and in case of a major emergency will wear a yellow vest to be easily identified.

Notes:

Evacuation of the church (examples: fire, toxic fume)- Gathering area will be established behind Building C or other designated area (LISTEN TO USHERS) and medical assistance will be available. Ushers need to ensure that any emergency vehicles can enter and leave the parking lot. Do not attempt to move cars in the parking lot unless permission is given by ushers.

Potential for severe weather conditions- Stay home if you feel that attending a church event may put you in danger. Consider attending Mass at an alternate time. There is not a safe shelter in the church from severe storms and leaving the church may not be an option.

Violence outside the church- Church doors will be locked (announcement made) and parishioners will remain in the church until ushers are notified by law enforcement that any potential dangerous situation has been neutralized.

Violent/Agitated Person inside the church- Ushers and trained individuals have been instructed how to respond to this type of situation. If you become aware of an agitated/suspicious individual notify an usher as soon as possible. Do not approach or engage with the individual.

Active shooter- If there is an active shooter situation you will be instructed to GET BELOW THE PEWS-THERE IS A PERSON WITH A GUN. At the onset of the attack where shots are being fired, law enforcement parishioners, military and trained armed parishioners must engage the active shooter.

This plan was developed by the St. Francis Xavier safety committee after attending a diocesan safety meeting last fall. The plan has been reviewed by the Junction City Police Department.




Friendly Reminders!




