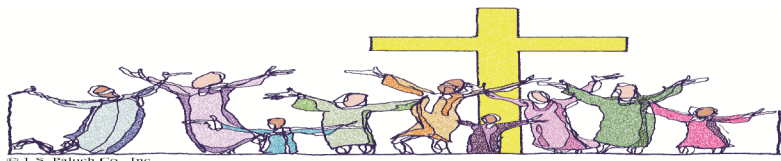

LENT: In Lent, as we are all year, we are focusing on the two great commandments: love of God and love of neighbor. However, Lent gives us a concrete or more specific way to live them out: The Gospel for Ash Wednesday sets the path: prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

Fr. Timothy Radcliffe, the priest Pope Francis asked to lead the opening session of the recent Synod, combines both of these in a beautiful way. In prayer, we live are conscious of our duty to love God above all else. In almsgiving, we practice of our neighbor. But the second commandment, he reminds, ends with "....as yourself."

He goes on to say that fasting is a very good way to love yourself. Your doing with less reminds you that you have more control over yourself than you may have thought. By fasting in one area, you gain the strength to "fast from sin" to quote St. Augustine. In the end, I would note that even this is outward focused: my fasting from sin helps me love God and others more.

Finally, what better way than the Rice Bowl: eat less (fasting), give the saved money to others (the Rice Bowl) and then pray for them....to God.
