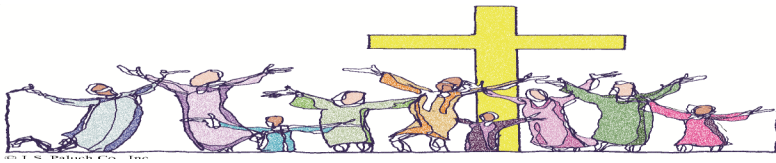

SCRUTINIES: Not a word we hear every day in our culture! In the liturgy, this word refers to the rites that the Catechumens (those preparing to be baptized at Easter) will undergo during the 2nd, 3rd and 4th Sundays of Lent.

Lent is a time of a more intense spiritual preparation for the catechumens and candidates (those baptized in another faith tradition and joining us at Easter through the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist). Through them, it is a more intense time for all of us. Interestingly, the church's liturgy encourages not to focus so much on beliefs and teachings "but more a time of a deeper knowledge of Christ."

During one of the weekend Masses (probably the 11:00), the catechumens and candidates will come before the assembly and ask us to pray over them as they enter this deep time of self-searching and repentance. They will strive (and we with them) to "heal all that is weak, defective or sinful..."

After this, they "are to be dismissed" to reflect on all they have heard and undergone. As they are not able to participate in Holy Communion, they are to go forth to "feed on the table of the Word as we feed on the Lord in the Eucharist."
